We are cleaning up our neighborhood abandoned homes. It was the decision to cut the property at 980 Hedgewood after many months of struggle with the city and attempt to contact the previous owner. Our homeowner just left the home and several pine trees were dead and falling on the roof, in the yard and threatening the neighbor's home. One tree had fallen and the other two finally fell in one of the recent storms. We had the mess cleaned up and the property is due to be mowed if not done already. The other two properties are 11474 Mollylea and 11677 Glenhaven with the Glenhaven property being the worse by far. It will be put in a presentable condition and the intent is for the immediate neighborhood to adopt the care for the abandoned property or else it will cause indirect impact on the property values in our area. We either maintain the yards with hope they are eventually sold to responsible families or let them go and we will have blight again. There is not much of an option. Comments are welcomed.

Tickets are being given to those parking on the grass, parking on sidewalks and parking the wrong direction on the street... but not enough are being held accountable. Others are moving in to our area and either they do not know the law or they do not care about the law. In any case we must hold everyone accountable for obeying the laws or we lose the very controls that will keep the property values stable. Our investment will slip as we allow the city laws and deed restrictions to be ignored. I have both posted on our website <http://www.sfcabr.org> and would be happy to help you find the law that governs the subject of interest. Make it your business to know what the laws are... just because you are not familiar with the law doesn't mean it is not there.

Let us try to keep Sherwood Forest a good neighborhood to live in. Obey our laws and deed restrictions. We have enough challenges to face without causing more issues by not following the laws that keep values high and insure safe neighborhoods.
