Title 11 Traffic Code

Chapter 23 MISCELLANEOUS RULES

Sec. 11:289. Parking, storing or driving motor

(a) No person, owner of any motor vehicle or watercraft or person having a motor vehicle or watercraft registered in his or her name shall personally or allow any other person to park or stop such motor vehicle or watercraft at any of the following places except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with a law enforcement officer's direction or in compliance with a parking control device:

(1) Upon a neutral ground, right-of-way, sidewalk, strip of land between a property line and street curb, or other public way;

(c) Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00), or imprisoned for not more than six (6) months or both.

Chapter 28 PARKING

Sec. 11:415. Stopping, standing or parking prohibited; general rules.

(a) No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, or permit a vehicle registered in his name to be stopped, standing or parked, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a law enforcement officer or traffic-control device, or parking-control device in any of the following places:

(1) On a sidewalk;

(6) Within twenty-five (25) feet of a crosswalk or curblin at an intersection;

(7) Within thirty (30) feet upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic-control signal located at the side of a roadway;

(22) On the grass in a yard between the residence and the street of any lot in the A1, A2, A2.5, A3 or A4 districts and in recognized subdivisions in the rural district.

Sec. 11:416. Parking on neutral ground, parks, rights-of-way, sidewalks and other public and private places prohibited.

(a) No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle or permit a vehicle registered in his name to be stopped, standing or parked, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the law and directions of a police officer or traffic parking-control device, at any of the following places:

(1) Upon a neutral ground, right-of-way, sidewalk, strip of land between a property line and street curb, or other public way.

(b) Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or be imprisoned for not more than six (6) months, or both.

Sec. 11:423. Time limitation on parking on any street.

No person shall permit his vehicle, either as an operator or registered owner, to remain parked on any street for a period of time longer than nine (9) hours of any twenty-four-hour period beginning at 6:00 a.m., of one day to 6:00 a.m., of the next day, and the vehicle can only be so parked if parking is specifically permitted under other provisions of this title.
